### What should I already know?

#### Painting

Use thick and thin brushes.

Mix primary colours to make secondary colours.

Add white to make tints and black to make tones.

Create colour wheels.

Explore different paint- understanding of the properties of the medium

### What will I know at the end of the unit?

#### Painting

Work back into your painting with paint, pen or coloured pencil to develop the imaginative imagery

Understand that primary colours can be mixed to make secondary colours of different hues

Create an arrangement of objects or elements. Use as the focus for an abstract still life painting using gestural marks using skills learnt above.

#### Drawing

Draw lines of different sizes and thicknesses using a range of materials( chalk, pastels, pens, crayons, paint)

Use drawing exercises to focus an exploration of observational drawing, mark making and **pattern/texture and shape/form**.

Show pattern and texture by adding dots and lines.

Collect natural objects, and explore one composition and qualities of objects through arranging, sorting & representing.

Colour your work neatly with good control, following the lines.
