

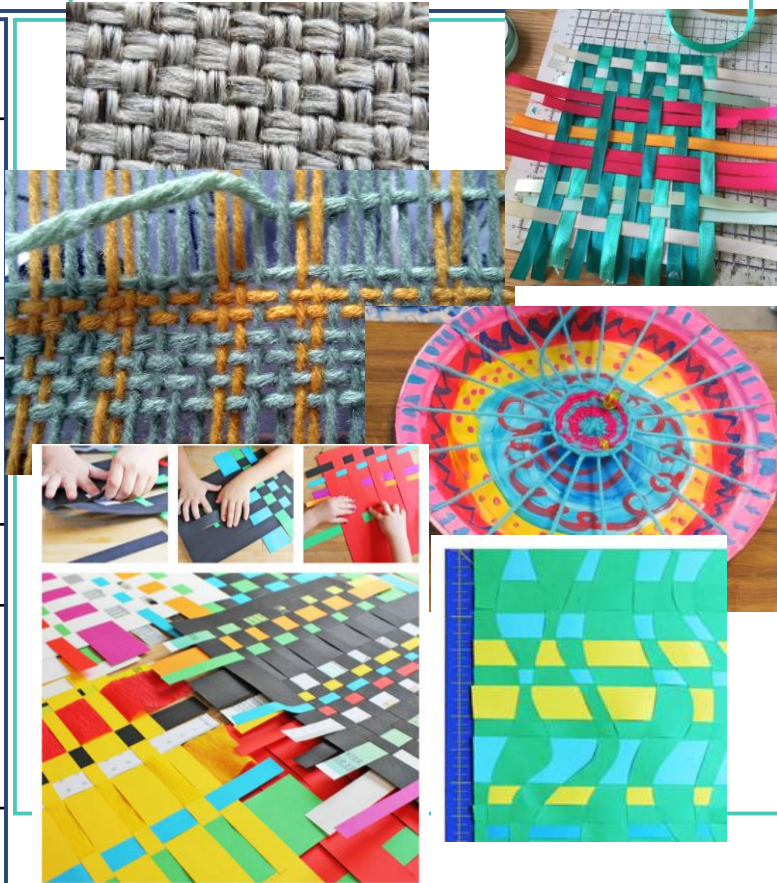

<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Pattern	A pattern is an arrangement of lines or shapes, especially a design in which the same shape is repeated
Texture	The texture of something is the way that it feels when you touch it.
Material	Cloth or fabric.
Weave	If you weave something, you make it by crossing threads over and under each other
Join	To fix or fasten things together
Stitch	If you stitch cloth, you use a needle and thread to join two pieces together
Dye	If you dye something such as hair or cloth, you change its colour by soaking it in a special liquid.
