

<u>Key</u> Vocabulary	<u>Definition</u>
Van Gough	Vincent Van Gogh was a Dutch post- impressionist painter who is among the most famous and influential figures in the history of Western art.
Light	An area of something that is brighter or paler than its surroundings.
Dark	Not reflecting much light; approaching black in shade.
Primary colour	Any of a group of colours from which all other colours can be obtained by mixing. (Shades of red, blue and yellow).
Secondary colour	A colour resulting from the mixing of two primary colours.
Tint	A shade or variety of a colour.
Tone	The particular quality of brightness, deepness, or hue of a shade of a colour.
