- ask questions about the significant experiences of key figures from religions and suggest answers from own and others' experiences.
- ask questions about puzzling aspects of life and experiences and suggest answers, referring to religion.
- Ask questions about matters of right and wrong and suggest answers that show understanding of moral and religious issues
