Gingerbread Madness!!!




ENGLAND ROCKS ... AND SO DID YEAR 4!

Year 5- Maths Play



Over the past week, the children in Year 5 have been developing a Maths game. We looked at an original concept that was based on adding three 3 digits numbers together and added our own ideas. These included making our own dice or spinner, inserting a joker and creating own scorecards.





On the final afternoon, we invited our parents in to teach them the rules and play our games with them.

I enjoyed playing my game with my Mum. When we got home, I was able to play the game with my Mum.

It has been a busy term for Year 6. We began the term by learning to play different tunes on strange tube-like instruments called boom whackers. Each colour creates a different note. The children started to play simple songs to start with, such as old Mc Donald and then as their confidence and ability increased, they went on to more complex tunes such as Star Wars. They thought it was great fun and really enjoyed whacking them on the floor to create the notes. It was tricky as hitting them at exactly the same time took a lot of practice.



Our topic this term has been Ancient Greece. The children have learnt about different types of government, listened to Greek myths and seen how pottery in Ancient Greece portrays real life as well as heroic moments and sport. They practiced drawing the different iconic patterns and creating their own design.

There has been Children in Need and Times Table Rock Star day. Crazy costumes and lots of Maths challenges. Now the whole year group is continually aiming to reach the next level. Lots of fun had by all.

Reading Champions

Our new Reading Champions are busy promoting Reading for Pleasure in their classrooms. Each KS2 class has a Reading Champion who is responsible for leading initiatives in their class about reading. Some off them make book recommendations whilst others lead small reading groups each week. We are very lucky to have a group off dedicated and enthusiastic children who enjoy sharing their passion for reading with their peers.



Teacher Reading Group

A number of teachers at St Paul's are participating in a Teacher Reading Group. They are participating in regular training and developing exciting projects in their classes and year groups to promote Reading for Pleasure. In the Early Years, children are creating 'Reading Rivers'. Families are creating fantastic Reading Rivers with their children. These help us to better understand children's interests and exposure to text at home. We can provide texts which appeal to our children to suit their needs.







At the beginning of the term, the Year 4 children were invited to apply to become an IPC member. The IPC **(International Pupil Council)** is a group of children that meet from various schools in Hastings to talk about our links with Sierra Leone.

There is an overall theme to the meetings which is about ways to improve our environment.

At the recent meeting, our reps Sophie and Eva were talking about ways that we can practically help in our school. These include:

Ensuring we use both sides of paper for drawing and doodling. Making sure lights and white boards are off if we leave a classroom.



Multi-functional Space

Whether it's physical play, creative exploration, socialising, an outside classroom, or the venue for an event, our design will work as a versatile and multi-use space.A box seating area doubles as a climbing structure, a stage, or a classroom, with planting to bring shade, height, and nature into the playground.

A Unique and Dynamic Play Area

Our vision is to make something really different for our school – to think outside the box for what a play area can be. We hope to make the design an eye-catching and inspiring space which promotes non-descriptive play and where children can be active and inspired by their environment.

Transient Space

The middle playground is a busy area with many people moving through it in all directions.

We would like to use arches and patterned floor paint to direct and control this movement while making it a fun place for children to explore.

Colour and Materials

We are researching recycled plastics and other hard-wearing materials which we can use in our playground to create these exciting structures. We want to move away from a traditional "children's" colour palette, but still one that is bright and fun.

A Place for Everyone

Not only will this area be enjoyed by the children, but it will also act as a great meeting place for parents to gather and socialise at the end of the day in the quieter, calmer corners where they can meet and chat.
