

The children innovated the story and drew or wrote the first section using adjectives to describe their new character and their new mode of transport




Story time with Miss Watson and Winnie







Children's Mental Health Week

Week this year with all pupils having lessons
about this year's theme which is 'Know Yourself,
Grow Yourself.' The theme aims to help our
children to understand themselves so they can be
more prepared to deal with their emotions and
how they cope with life's up and downs.



5 top tips from Place2Be to support your child

- 1. **Encourage journaling**. Encourage your child to express their emotions and feelings through journaling
- 2. Make space for reflection. Go for a walk, drive, or try mindful colouring or baking together. Children will find it easier to reflect on their different emotions and also to understand themselves better if they can talk in a relaxed way.
- 3. **Be visual**. Use imagery, such as emojis or flashcards to help children and young people to recognise and label their feelings.
- 4. **Practice mindfulness**. Try mindful activities and quiet family time to enjoy being in the present moment.
- 5. **Communicate**. Feedback is crucial for helping us see our blind spots and gain greater insight into ourselves. Creating safe and supportive ways to share your own experience will help your child to understand themselves.




