


Year 2-Alexandra Park

Many fun events are planned including the Feller Express Dinosaur Encounter, Adventures with Reptiles, retro video games, a scavenger hunt and more.

All reading challenges are tracked through our online portal hosted by Beanstack.

Here everyone can track reading, activities completed and enter prize drawings. Parents, you can manage all readers' logs in one place and log family reading time in one entry.

Teens and other adults can create and manage accounts too!

The process is simple:

- 1. Register you and/or your children on Beanstack (see video help below).
 - 1. If you created a Beanstack account for for an earlier reading program you still need to sign in and enroll in the Summer Reading program.
- 2. Log Reading & Activities online or with the companion app (see video help below).
- 3. Earn badges and rewards, plus enter for prize drawings.

Apps

Apps can be a positive place for young people to socialise with peers. Many enable instant messaging, social networking and image sharing.

Some, like YouTube, can also be a great creative outlet. But consider:

- Privacy settings and age relevance
- · Talking to them about the content they share
- Discussing the consequences of sharing messages and images

Gaming

Gaming is fun but be aware that it can be all consuming. Some things to consider:

- · Use the gaming consoles' safety settings
- Agree with your child how much time they can spend playing online
- · Pay attention to the PEGI (age) ratings and what they mean
- Remember that some online games have inbuilt chat functions
- Be aware that your child might use servers or 3rd party applications to access interactive online communities.

Instant Messaging

Instant Messaging is a great way to socialise and keep up to date with what's going on right now. However there is a risk of unsolicited contact. If your child is using messenger services you should:

- Look at the privacy settings
- Ensure they understand that they may be talking to people they don't know and the risks this brings
- Talk to them about what is and isn't appropriate to send.

- Spending unhealthy amounts of time online.


Have a conversation

This exhibition showcases artworks from two school projects that encouraged creative expression while facilitating discussions about race, identity and global community issues.

Playing the Race Card conducted two art workshops at Hastings Academy in 2023. The first workshop, led by artist Mo El-Kadey, used anti-colonial Primitive Surrealism to unleash students' inner talents through multidisciplinary techniques and music.

The second workshop, led by artist Sarah Buller, explored central themes of identity and joy through photography, encouraging students to develop their own visual style using collage.

Anti-Racism Posters

Following an incident outside St. Paul's Academy, the school organised an anti-racism poster competition. Judged by Kristina McDonald, school Site Assistant, alongside artist Becky Beasley and Claudine Eccleston, founder of Playing the Race Card, the winning entries are showcased in this exhibition.
