## Reception Zibrary Visit

STORYTELLING AND PLAYING CLASSICAL MUSIC FOR YOUNG CHILDREN



#### Reception trip to the library.

All of our reception classes enjoyed a trip to Hastings
Library earlier this term. After finding out about how special
our local Library is, they joined in with a Story Telling and
Music workshop with the London Mozart Players. They joined
in with songs, learnt about the different "colours" of music
and listened to famous stories retold with musical
accompaniment. Afterwards the children told us how much
they had liked listening to the cello and violin and the ways
they can be played to create different moods.

## Year 1-Beach Trip











On Thursday, Year 1 had their trip to the beach. The day started off very windy and cloudy, but despite this the children quickly got stuck into exploring all the different features of this environment. The children found crabs, anemones and plenty of jellyfish in the rock pools. On the stones they used the shells and scavenged materials to create some fab beach art. While on the sand they built some amazing sandcastles, rivers and towers, but none of them were strong enough to stop waves when the tide came in.

The day ended with a welcome bit of sunshine and an ice-cream on the pier - the perfect end to a long day at the beach.

### Hear 3-Marianne North art project

In 3JS, we started an Art project in conjunction with Hastings Museum. Austen from the Museum and Stephanie, a local artist, came into our classroom. We drew pictures inspired by Marianne North, a botanical artist, who was born in Hastings. We made mood boards. Our next visit will be at the museum where our ideas will inspire the artists and we will be helping paint a mural.









## St Pauls antiracism competition

St Paul's launched an anti-racism poster competition in November. The background to the project was that there was a disagreement between parents at drop off around parking and one of our parents was subjected to racist abuse by another parent. As a school, we wanted to use this as an opportunity to address this head on with parents and to make it clear that we are an anti-racist school where racism is not tolerated. We launched a competition for the children to design an anti-racism poster and then invited members of the local community as well as our site assistant, Kristina, in to judge the competition.

We were overwhelmed with the response we received and the winning entries were made into banners which we have displayed on the gates to the school. The winning entries were also displayed in Hastings Museum as part of the Black Joy: Up close and personal exhibition which runs until the end of August. Alongside this, we are running a series of anti-racism lessons to further develop children's awareness and respect for one another. As a school, our aim is always to support the children in using their talents to make a positive difference to the world in which they live.

#### The Summer Reading Challenge

The <u>Summer Reading Challenge</u> encourages children aged 4 to 11 to read for pleasure over the summer holidays. The goal set by East Sussex Libraries is to read 6 weeks over the 6-week break. A prize is awarded for every book they read and after the sixth book is read, they receive a medal and certificate too!

Joining the Summer Reading Challenge is simple! From 6th July 2024 when the challenge starts, you can <u>sign your child up</u>.

We hope that lots of our pupils will sign up or this challenge. It is always exciting when we receive a pile of certificatesto present to the children in our Golden Galleon assemblies.
