


We had 3 school winners in the writing competition also. We cannot wait to find out the next book focus and get involved in this inclusive community project again.



The children had a wonderful time, we will definitely use the playground again. St Paul's Together






The school has had dozens of little visitors to help the children explore the seasonal changes and the life cycles of different animals.

Bluebell water colour paintings from my Nature club Miss Blackman




















I love being a Reading Champion because I enjoy reading with other children, sharing poems with my class and sharing my love of books.
