Boudicca	The Celtic Queen of the Iceni tribe of modernday East Anglia, Britain, who led a revolt against Rome in 60/61 CE
The Romans	Romans were a group of people who belonged to the Roman Empire. The city of Rome, in Italy, was the centre of this empire.
Julius Caesar	In the year 55 BC, Julius Caesar was emperor of Rome.
The Celts	The Celts were a collection of tribes with origins in central Europe that shared a similar language, religious beliefs, traditions and culture.

43 AD	Romans invaded Britain.
60 Ad- 61 AD	Boudicca lead a revolt against the Romans.
410 AD	The Romans left Britain.

Legate	The person in charge of the Legion.
Forum	Square in the middle of streets that are used to share news and markets.
Invaders	Invaders are people who use force to enter a place and take over, usually with an army
