Colonise	Send settlers to (a place) and establish political control over it.
Danelaw	The area in Britain that the Danish Vikings ruled over.
Longship	A Viking ship used for fighting and carrying out raids.
Monestry	Monasteries are places where monks live. Although the word "monastery" is sometimes used for a place where nuns live, nuns usually live in a convent or nunnery.
Witan	The council of the Anglo-Saxon kings in and of England; its essential duty was to advise the king on all matters on which he chose to ask its opinion.
